

# Code Explanation

When you run this code on a web server with PHP support, you will see the values of these variables displayed in your web browser.

The code is an HTML document with PHP code. It has 4 variables with different data types: an integer (`$day`), a double (`$salary`), a string (`$name`) and a boolean (`$exite`). Then print the values of the variables along with some descriptive text using the echo function in PHP.

-What does each part do?

`$day = 24;`: Declare an integer variable called `$day` and assign it the value 24.

`$salary = 758.43;`: Declare a double variable called `$salary` and assign it the value 758.43.

`$name = "john";`: Declares a string variable named `$name` and assigns it the value "john".

`$exite = true;`: Declares a boolean variable named `$exite` and assigns it the value true.

Then, using echo, output these variables along with some descriptive text into the HTML page. For example, "Integer variable:" followed by the value of `$day`, "Double variable:" followed by the value of `$salary`, and so on.
